

"At the time, most spec-home builders weren't investing as much time and money as I did, but it worked." In fact, the home was purchased by the president of an interior design school, who appreciated its unique look and feel. Morris' early success fueled his passion. "I gained the courage to take bigger and bolder risks on the next home," he reveals.



"I'm always thinking of ways to improve my work, to generate ideas for new designs and details," he reveals. "At this point, I could take the easier route and build my spec homes in a similar style. I prefer to keep each home unique, though. It keeps me fresh, and fires my passion for what I do."
